Classification Manager's Report

If you're new to the club or haven't shot a club shoot yet, I encourage you to come out and shoot. Pick up a score card from the mail box on the storage building, complete your shooter information (see range board kisok for shooting styles, etc.) and score as you go.



Targets 1-14 will always have animal targets on the secondary bales. Shoot all 28 targets and 14 animal targets as detailed below for your "club shoot" score.

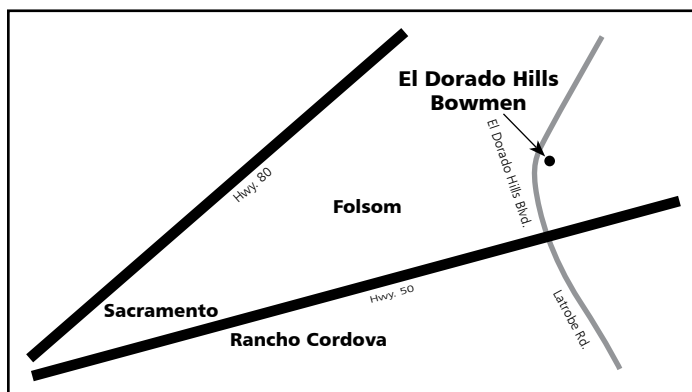
